I have been serving the Newport Hills Community Club for the past four years, collaborating with the City of Bellevue in support of our neighborhood identification/enhancement/art projects, enthusiastically serving Bellevue Life Spring 10+ years, (formerly Overlake Service League for the past 100 years), passionately coaching local young and adult athletes for 20+ years and help organize a variety community events. I plan to deepen my community involvement this year especially as it pertains to community outreach, public safety, promote FUN neighborhood gatherings, facilitating the renewal of the block watch program between neighbors and Detective Chinn (rchinn@bellevuewa.gov) and support communication solutions so neighbors receive important community updates in a timely fashion. Fun historical tidbit about me: I am native to the Puget Sound Region where my family homesteaded on Orcas Island in the late 1800s, establishing a lineage of community involvement and public service. In 1881 the Viereck family began rowing out to intercept US mail from a mail boat, then rowed the mail bags back to Doe Bay, carried the mail bags for a rigorous 24-mile journey on horseback while delivering mail to homes, businesses and mail stops. As a result, a ship-to-shore connection and post office were established so all Island residents received their mail in a timely fashion. This piece of my historical past has genuinely inspired me to find ways to establish meaningful connections in my community. It also sheds light on how innovation and technology are reshaping the methods in which we communicate with each other.

The Newport Hills community is comprised of people who like to interface with their neighbors and communicate in various ways. Some of us may be highly technical, who prefer electronic emails over paper and enjoy reading text messages while promoting “green mailings”, while other people prefer chatting over a cup of tea or coffee in person or receiving a hard copy of the newsletter at their home. For this reason, we will continue to provide four methods of communication and mail out newsletters to Newport Hills residents.



SPAN Summit

Where are you going to be when the next disaster strikes? Do you have enough food and water stored? How will you let friends and family know you are ok, or if you are in need of assistance? What if the city was not there to help at all? These were some of the questions asked during the Strengthening Preparedness Among Neighbors (SPAN) Summit on February 3rd, hosted by the City of Bellevue Office of Emergency Management (OEM). The keynote speaker and Emergency Preparedness Coordinator Vernon Owens highlighted the goals of the OEM and engaged the forty-five community representatives with dialogue on how the City of Bellevue can do more and what citizens need to do to help themselves in an emergency.

The most common type of disasters we face in the Northwest is weather related. Typically we have widespread power losses during windstorms, snow and ice storms that clog roads, and seasonal flooding. The SPAN program was developed to promote "neighborhood ownership and commitment (volunteerism)" to preparedness. Individuals need to have enough food and water stored for at least three days. Neighbors need to "check in" with each other and see if additional help is needed. And neighborhood organizations need to pool their resources and report to the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). We can't help others until we have helped ourselves.

Being prepared doesn't take a lot of money, and just a little bit of time. If you would like more information or if you would like to attend a SPAN workshop you can contact the Bellevue Office of Emergency Management by phone (425-452-6813), visit the website (www.bellevuewa.gov/emergency_preparedness.htm), or join them on Facebook (www.tinyurl.com/bellevueoem). We had a very busy year in 2010 in terms of Shopping Center activity. As 2010 NHCC President, I worked alongside the City of Bellevue, Lake Heights residents, Stods and Shopping Center property owners and Newport Hills Swim and Tennis club to kick off two Phases towards revitalization. Phase I provided ideas on what type of businesses we could/could not support with our current population and Phase II provided several high-level scenarios of potential future development with return on investment for land owner and/or investors. Both of these presentations were informative. If you were unable to make the meetings, you can view a recap of each of these events and the presentation provided in Phase I. Newport Hills Park Update

Here is a mid-winter update for your Newport Hills Park.

Thank you NHCC for the wonderful donation of 1000 Daffodil bulbs! These were recently planted and will provide a nice splash of color in spring. The majority of the bulbs were planted in among the flowering trees along the SE 60th frontage bed. Bulbs were also planted around the entrance

sign and in the 120th turnaround island.

The baseball field will continue to remain closed through the winter and into the spring as the grass outfield needs to establish completely before it can be open for public use. We will open the field as soon as we feel the turf has established well enough to support the heavy public demand that will be placed on it. Park crews will be checking and maintaining it weekly and once the growing season begins. Thanks for your patience.



Through November, December, and January a few other minor park improvements occurred; these included adding some drainage along the south end of the park, ivy removal along the west edge planting bed, adding a ADA accessible picnic table at the gazebo, and replacing one slide with a fireman's pole at the play ground.

Some additional improvements to watch for in next month or two will include; paving and striping the north park lot area, pruning along the west perimeter, and landscape planting improvements throughout the park. We will also begin planning for a NH's Park Grand Opening in late spring or early summer when the baseball field is open for use. We will make sure to send out an event update as soon as we have firm date.

Wise Advice from Det. Richard Chinn

Det. Chinn from the Bellevue Police Department spoke at the NHCC meeting in January. Here are the highlights:

- One-third of all burglaries are due to unlocked doors and windows.
- You need to be aware of your neighborhood and feel comfortable calling 911.
- A Fake TV unit will simulate a TV flickering.
- A bar on sliding glass doors are visual to people as opposed to the ones that lie at the bottom of the door.
- Det. Chinn recommends the Door Club and security film for windows.

- Crime map: <http://bellevuewa.gov/crimemap/>
- Det. Chinn suggests Newport Hills and Lake Heights establish a Block Watch program. Email is a good way for Det. Chinn to get in touch with block captains. Share phone numbers with your neighbors so you can call when you see something suspicious.
- How to safely avoid crime: Lock doors and windows; buy a locking mailbox; cover your garage windows; don't ignore door knocking – reply in your voice. Watch the person leave and if he walks behind the house, call 911. Install alarm signs that you pound into the ground in front of your house. Write down serial numbers of your expensive equipment! Store the info in a safe place or off site.
