

1. Call to Order. The meeting was called to order by President Michelle Hilhorst.
2. President's Report. Michelle Hilhorst.
 - a. Opening comments. The Neighborhood Enhancement Program voting results are in. The announcement highlighting the top three projects was sent to Newport Hills and Lake Heights neighbors. Michelle asked Rich Dolleman "Will there be money in the budget for these projects?" Rich responded that he is still waiting on news from the City about this.
 - b. A Community Faire with food, vendor booths, etc. is planned for September 25 and a Community Garage Sale on October 2. The garage sale will be held at individual driveways, not at a central location. Unsellable items may be donated to charity. There might be a recycling drive to get rid of larger items.
 - c. Fall planting event, October 16: The area at the SE 60th trailhead and the Newport Hills entrance sign will receive new greenery that community volunteers need to plant as part of the deal with the City for these plants.
 - d. Mini park landscaping. Once the paperwork has been completed, this project will go forward.
3. Secretary's Report, Debra Haraldson. Approval of the minutes: Motion made, seconded and carried to approve the minutes from April and May.
4. Vice President's Report, Lisa Viereck. There is construction equipment in the Newport Hills Park with a fence around it for safety. Posted on the property is a description of what is going to be done to the park. The park will be closed from mid-July to the end of the year. The new park down the street from the old Eastside Catholic High School is undergoing the removal of the foundation. NHCC would appreciate the community's input on what kind of park it wants in this space.

7. Committee Reports.
 - a. Membership, Sandi Tampa. Not present. Currently we have 495 members against a goal of 600.

 - c. Website, Grace Whiteaker. Grace is researching survey tools to collect ideas about rejuvenating the NH Shopping Center. Someone asked "Where is the data that was collected at last years' 4th of July picnic?" Michelle will find out. Grace has added Google Analytics to the web site.
 - d. Community Outreach.
 - i. Picnic at the Newport Hills Park, Lisa Viereck. See attached schedule and food drive information.
 - ii. Car Show, August 14 at the Community Church. NHCC is not sponsoring this event but it can help promote it on the website.
8. Public Safety. Position Open.
9. Land Use and Community Appearance, Tom Boydell City of Bellevue Economic Development, an update on issues surrounding the NH Shopping Center. The City is currently working on a draft scope of work, interviewing consultants to analyze retail potential and land use code, shopping patterns, what's allowed on the property, existing

market restrictions, and potential use of the property. A consultant might be hired as early as July and retail research could be completed by mid August. The NHCC could invite the consultants to meet the community in September. The family who owns the NH Shopping Center property has been invited to the picnic by Michelle. Tom suggested sending him the picnic schedule and he will distribute it to the other property owners.
