

A. President Report.

- a. Heidi passed around a get well card for Kelly O’Neil for all to sign.
- b. Local Events Recap: About 150 kids attended the Spring Egg Hunt; the 4-H Cat Show was a hit and several people showed up for the Book Swap.
- c. There will be a Hot Rods and Motorcycle Show at the NH Community Church on May 24.
- d. The urban boulevard/art project is moving forward and is almost ready to be installed. The bus shelters will not be installed yet as Metro has not been as responsive as we’d like.
- e. Tyler Park Update: The survey concluded Option 1 is the clear preference of residents (70%.) The results are now with the COB Parks Department. Staffers are reviewing them to see how they might be able to make Option 1 happen, including prioritizing different components of the plan. After their review and discussion with the Park Planning Committee, Heidi will invite them to a future monthly meeting to discuss next steps.
- f. The Executive Committee decided that the 4th of July Parade and Picnic will not take place in its current form due to low volunteerism. There is a possibility that a scaled-down version (children’s parade, games, raffle, bring your own picnic lunch, etc.) will be planned if space can be found at a low cost. The Club will provide soda, water, and chips for a two hour event.
